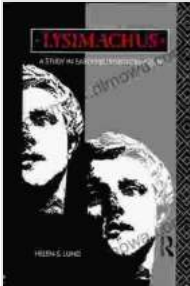

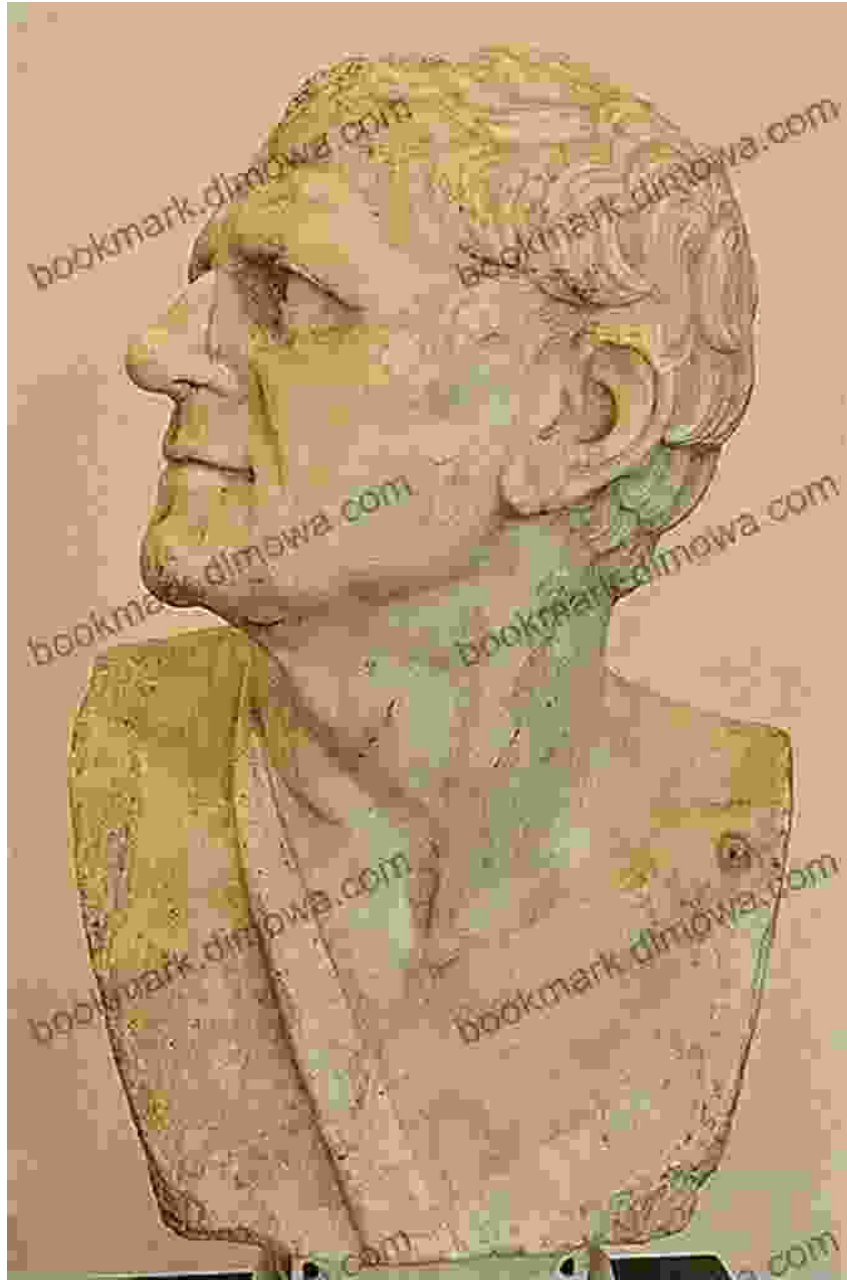

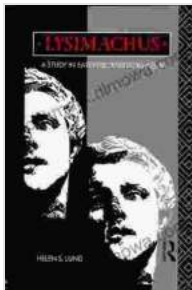


A silver coin depicting Lysimachus, bearing the title of "basileus"

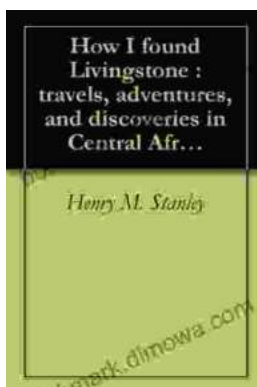
