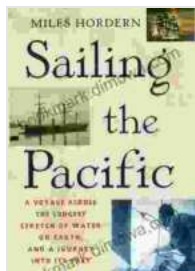

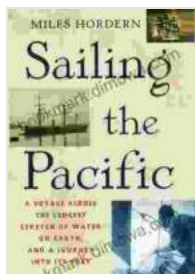
Eric Hansen is a renowned author and explorer. He has written over a dozen books about the oceans, including *The Great Sea*, *The Bird Islands*,
